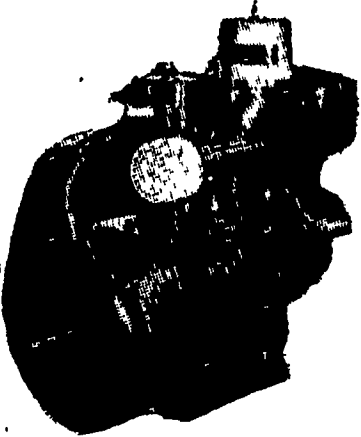

All interested farmers and agriculture businessmen are invited.

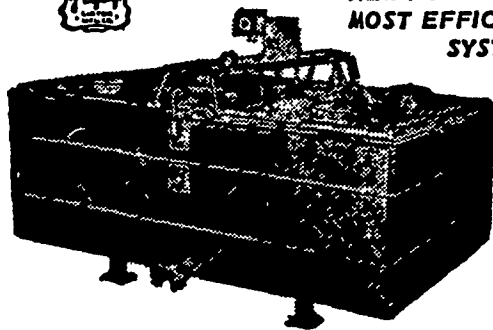

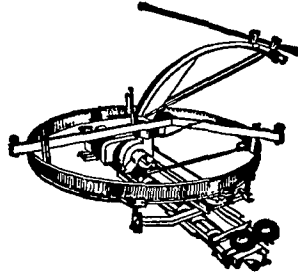
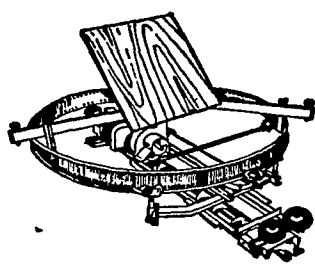
