State Peach Producers To Vote On Self-Assessment Plan

State peach producers will vote some time in June on a proposal to assess themselves for funds to be used for advertising, promotion and research

Plans formulated by a sub cimmittee of the State Peach Marketing Council, call for an assessment of three cents a hundredweight on peaches sold for the fresh market and one cent on peaches sold for pro cessing

The self-assessment plan. which would provide \$20 000 \$25,000, would affect only State Horticultural Association and the State Peach Marketing Council.






