## Eastern Pennsylvania And New Jersey

Prices held unchanged on light type hens. Demand continues good. Offerings barely adequate to short of needs. Processors report increased amount of condemnation often present, especially in older, recycled flocks, being charged back to producers in most quarters. Local offerings of heavy hens limited and generally short of current interest. Offerings from outside of area also short of full call. Demand fair to occasionally good. Prices paid: Farm Light Type Hns 8-10½ M 9½-10¼c. TURKEYS—Local offerings short of a fair to good seasonal interest on young hens with occasional receipts from North Carolina noted to fill needs. Limited processing of light weight hens and toms reported.

## Exchange Eastern Shore

Broiler and live flyer prices averaged 18.65 cents a pound this week. Prices ranged from a high of 20.3 cents a pound on Tuesday to a low of 17.7 cents

a pound on Thursday. Total sales were 188,800 head down 134,800 head from last week.

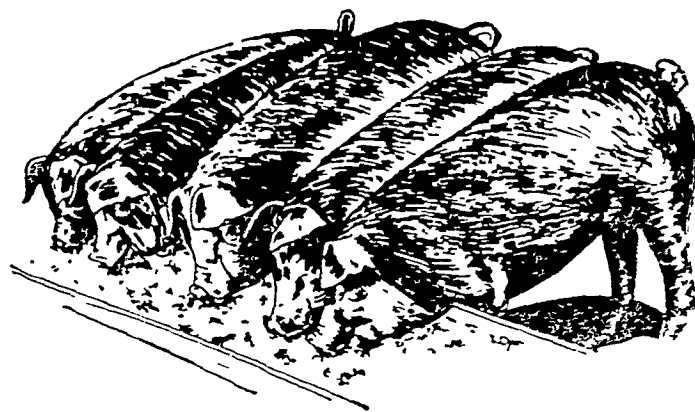
