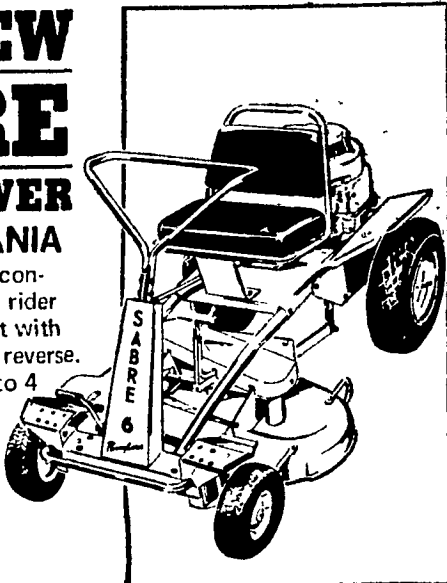

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Read the label and observe safety precautions when you use pesticides paints, cleaning fluids,

or other household chemicals.

Wear rubber gloves and other protective clothing as directed on the label.

If chemicals are spilled on your skin or clothing, wash the affected areas thoroughly with soap and water and remove chemically soaked clothing as soon as possible.

When spraying or dusting, avoid contact with the skin and prolonged inhalation of mists or dusts.

Remember to read the instructions on the label each time you use a pesticide or an insecticide whether you use it indoors or out.

The group heard a report that 84 persons received free antitetanus inoculations at Nissley's Farm Service. A follow-up clinic will be held at the same location April 17.
