Price Support Loans

Conservation Reserve Program
One farm in the County, under Conservation Reserve contract earned \$87 for maintaining 4 acres in grass cover

Wheat—113 farmers received \$74,957 on 59,242 bushel of wheat stored in local warehouses and 7 farmers received \$5,304 for 3,762 bushel of wheat stored on the farm

Wool Program
Payment of \$5867 was made in 1968 to 87 farmers for wool and unshorn lambs sold during

Barley—1 farmer received \$2,646 for 3000 bushel of barley stored on the farm
Corn—2 farmers received \$3

Total payment to 385 farms \$96,963

In addition \$4,895 of the 1968 ACP allocation was transferred to Soil Conservation Service for technical services needed in establishing permanent type practices, and small cost share increase of \$3,234 was paid on those farms earning less than \$200 payment

284 for 4000 bushel of corn Cropland Adjustment Program stored on the farm
Eight farmers earned diver-

son payments of \$6,812 on 261 acres of cropland retired into permanent cover Two of the farms received an additional \$300 per acre for permitting public access for hunting and hiking on 20 acres.

Farm Storage Facility Loan
One farmer received loan of \$308 toward purchase of grain storage bin

CCC Grain Bins
Lancaster County received ten surplus Commodity Credit Corporation Grain bins These were sold by bid to farmers in the county needing additional grain storage

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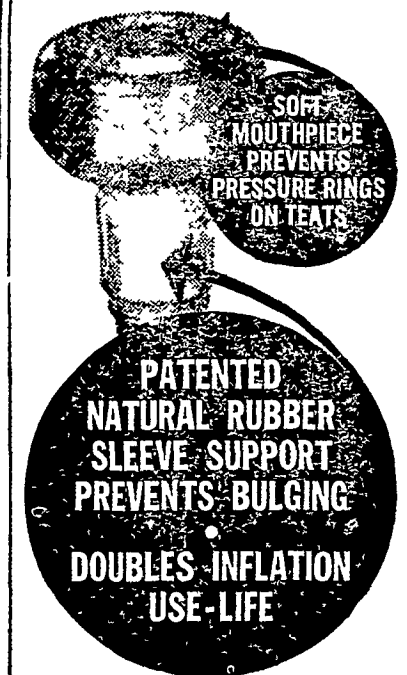
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
