John Herr, Steering Committee, gave the figure at the monthly meeting of the Foundation directors Tuesday night at the Farm Center. Herr said the total included about two-thirds cash and the remainder in pledges.

The treasurer's report passed out at the meeting listed total

Other County consignments bringing \$500 or more were from Paul Zimmerman, \$675; John Kreider, \$610; John Metzler, \$600 & \$500; Paul Sauder, \$560; Steven Stoltzfus, \$540 and Richard Hershey, \$500.

The sale of 62 bred heifers averaged \$534. Harold Ownes, Bucks County, was the sale chairman.

Clair Zerby To Leave Teaching To Sheep Farm

About 130 acres of hay will be waiting to be made in June when Clair Zerby, Vo-Ag Instructor at Warwick High School, gets his family and flock of Registered Hampshire breeding sheep moved to Tioga County. Clair's letter of resignation from his local school teaching post read at the Warwick school board meeting this week will be effective June 27.
