Society 20 entertained members from Societies 15 and 23. (Continued on Page 23)

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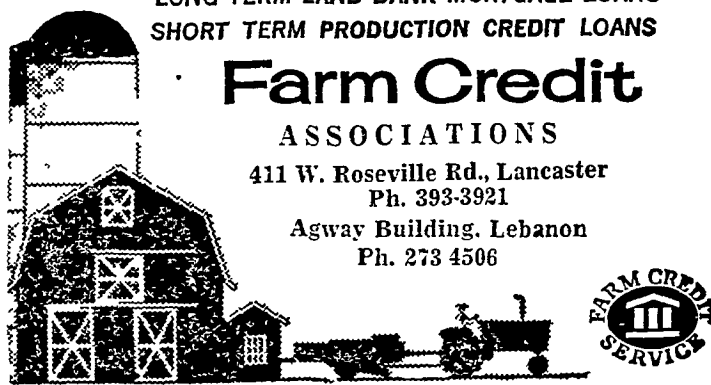
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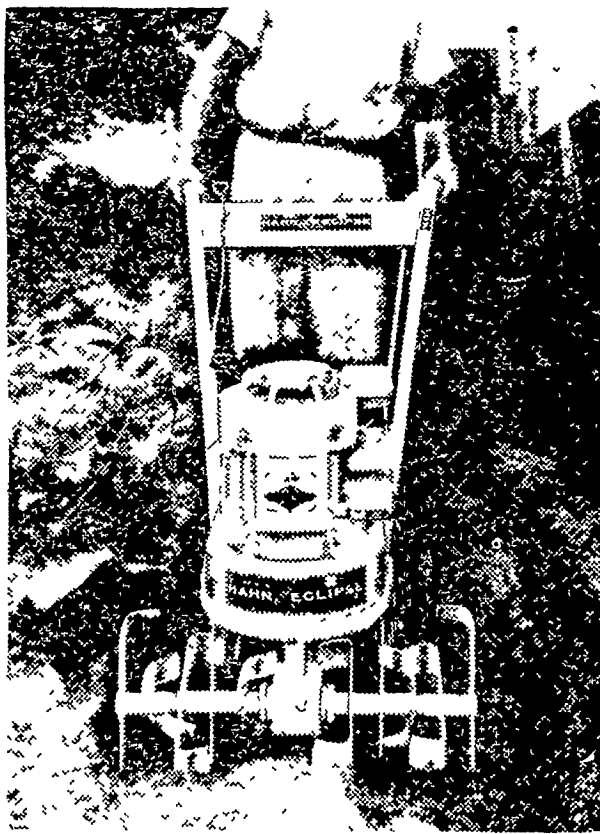


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
