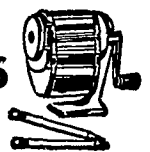

KEEP SHEEP ON
SPARETIME FARMS

Sheep fit well into sparetime
farming Their food and shelter
needs are readily met Little
equipment is needed.

According to a Pennsylvania
State University correspondence
course on sheep husbandry,
about ninety percent of sheep's
food are forages — pasture in
summer, hay and silage in win-
ter — all homegrown

Buildings of rough construc-
tion give sheep adequate shel-
ter The feed storages need to
be more weathertight than for
the animals Provide dry floors
and have the bays face east or
south with ready access to pas-
ture and exercise lots

Equipment needs are feed
racks for ewes, creep feeders
for lambs, and watering troughs
for both You biggest initial
expense may be for fences
