

# Local Legislators Participate In State 4-H Capitol Days Activities

HARRISBURG — Two county 4-H members — who will soon have a voice in shaping the laws of the future — called upon area legislators to explain the operations of State Government at citizenship activities here April 14-15.

The youths, Diane Heishey of New Holland and John Kutz of Elizabethtown, took a close-up look at government in action at State Capitol Days. They joined with 130 other Commonwealth 4-H'ers to take part in programs designed to help them become more responsible citizens.

The county delegates each with outstanding records of 4-H achievement, met with governmental officials observing the State House of Representatives and Senate while in session and toured the Capitol and William Penn Memorial Museum.

The lawmakers served as hosts April 14 when they invited the 4-H members to "sit in" while in session. Orientation programs were conducted by

Senator Preston B. Davis of Milton, representing the 27th Senatorial District, and Representative Mitchell W. Melton of North Philadelphia, from the 196th Congressional District.

At the Monday evening banquet two former state political leaders discussed the topic "Politics for Young People." Speakers were Craig Truax, past Republican state chairman, and Otis Morris, past Democratic state chairman.

# Pa. Egg Marketing Assn.

Vice-President John Wenger welcomed guests and called for the presentation of the Treasurer's report which was accepted.

Sam Berenson reported that there may be a very important legislative matter to report at the next meeting. Most marketers do not realize how much such an organization can mean to them at such a small cost. More members are urgently needed and every marketer needs the Exchange.

Don Horn explained the re-organization plan, indicating strongly that a strong one trade organization for the industry is needed. "The committee who worked on the new constitution and by-laws included — George Anthony, John Wenger, Gene Bailey, Dale Weaver, Roy Heckeluber, Mr Keefer, Don Parks, Dr. Kenneth Goodwin, Henk Wentink, George Hauer and Don Horn".

"The new constitution and by-laws have been accepted by the present Federation board but not by the membership."

"The objectives are—1 Support a full time male Executive Director, 2. Develop income producing projects to finance industry programs, an increased membership and fund raising

banquet. 3. Develop new organizational structure". "The draft is designed to represent all of the industry fairly and give strength by being united".

"The board will have 40 members and an executive committee of 9 members". "There will be Egg Marketing and Poultry Processors divisions along with co-operating members such as game breeders and county associations, general membership and any other group who may wish to associate".

Don Horn reviewed the constitution section by section as it was read by Homer Bicksler. During the discussion several questions were presented to obtain clarification and a suggestion was made that the word EGG be included in the name of the organization.

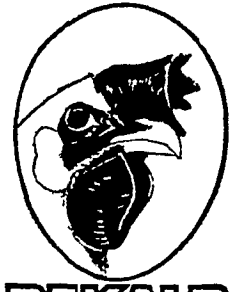
