—Require motorcycles to be equipped with rear-view mirrors as a supplement to safety legislation passed last year requiring the cyclist to wear protective headgear

—Provide for the registration of ambulance services and attendants and authorize the Secretary of Health to establish minimum training and equipment standards

—Establish uniform enforcement of the State Motor Vehicle Code by providing that it alone would govern arrests and convictions for traffic violations instead of permitting prosecutions by local authorities

—Prevent liability suits permit police cars to clock motorists in a variety of ways

—Broaden the little-known prohibition against installation of television sets within view of the driver to include all visual entertainment devices including the new swirling multi-colored lights against those persons qualified and authorized to administer blood tests under the driver intoxication bill passed last year.

—Require all police departments to use standard forms for traffic accident reports

—Require the Secretary of Revenue to prepare and maintain a list of hazardous moving vehicle violations significantly related to accidents

—Revise the Legislative Route numbering system to simplify record keeping for maintenance, accident reporting and other data uses

—Give the Secretary of Health the responsibility for determining testing procedures for blood alcohol content instead of leaving it under the Secretary of Revenue

Medicare Patients Urged To Keep Records Up-To-Date

Charles T. McCoy, Manager of the Lancaster Social Security Office, urges all patients under Medicare to maintain an up-to-date record of covered medical expenses. If a handy folder is needed, your social security office will provide you with a "Record of Medical Expenses"

Medical expenses which should be documented include medical and surgical services by a doctor of medicine or osteopathy, and outpatient hospital services

This record will be especially helpful to hospital admissions personnel if a patient receives diagnosis or treatment at a hospital but is not admitted as a bed patient.

"After covered medical expenses go over \$50 each calendar year, medical insurance will pay \$4 out of \$5 of the reasonable charges for all additional covered expenses for the rest of the year," McCoy said. "If the hospital is aware of your past medical expenses, reimbursement from Medicare will be speeded up."

We try to make all payments as quickly as possible, and with your help, Medicare payments can be made promptly. Do not

rely on your memory to recall expenses incurred months before. Keep your record current. Your record should include dates of treatment with kind of service received, and receipts for each payment." If you have a badly infested area turn your heifers and dry cows out first before leaving the milking herd graze. 2,4-D can control this weed however it should be done in the early stage of growth. If you should spray now it is necessary to keep the cows off of the sprayed area for 2 weeks.
