Keep Prepared Foods In Freezer For Quick Meals

For quick meals and entertaining, use your freezer and have foods on hand, suggests Mrs. Ruth J. Buck, extension foods and nutrition specialist of The Pennsylvania State University.

Before stocking up on ready-to-eat or convenience foods, plan the shopping and prepare and buy the foods carefully. Remember that freezing doesn't improve the quality of any food. It won't destroy organisms that bring about food spoilage, but freezing will inhibit the growth of such organisms.

Most frozen products are best if used within the recommended period of storage time for the specified food, says Mrs. Buck. Low temperature is the key to high-quality frozen food. Keep the temperature at zero or lower to prevent loss of nutritive value, flavor, color, and texture during storage.

Yeast breads and rolls freeze well, whether you bake your own or buy them. Cool homemade bread or rolls to room temperature, package in airtight, moisture-proof wrapping, and

freeze to zero degrees. When ready to use them, thaw in original wrapping or wrap in foil and heat 10 to 15 minutes. Maximum desired storage for these products is three months.

Cakes are best if baked before freezing and frosted after thawing. Cookies freeze well in any form but the dough is easier to package and takes up less freezer space than baked cookies. Fruit pies are at their best if frozen unbaked, then holes cut in the upper crust just before baking. Chiffon pie in a baked crust freezes well, but must be used within two or three weeks. However, cream pies, custard type pies, or meringues don't freeze satisfactorily, reminds Mrs. Buck.

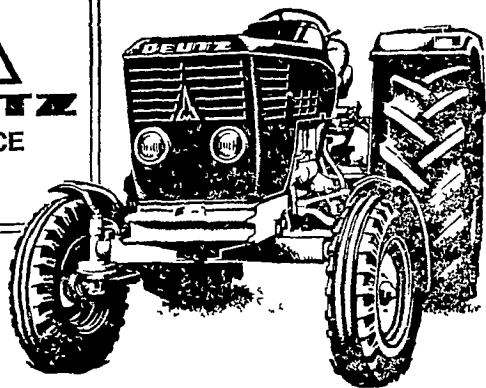
