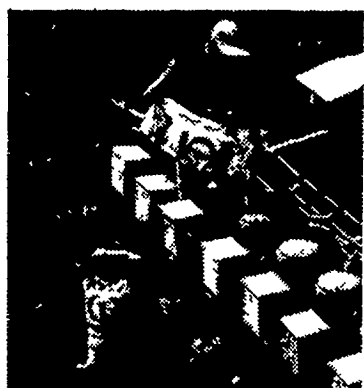
are sold before they ever leave the assembling point," he explains.

REVOLUTIONARY RUSSIANS

Soldiers who fired upon the peaceful demonstrators in front of the Winter Palace in 1905 really set off the Russian Revolution. This "Bloody Sunday," when 1,000 people were killed, was the first in a series of struggles that marked the Bolshevik attempt to gain power.

Pursued by the authorities, Nikolai Lenin went into hiding after the failure of his July, 1917 uprising. The "Father of the Revolution" had to disguise himself in a blonde wig to reenter Russia and direct the final successful rebellion.

Backgrounding Cattle

Ever hear of "backgrounding cattle"? It's a new term for an old practice — one that cattlemen are showing increased interest in, according to Kansas State economists.

They explain it involves feeding cattle from weaning date until the animals go into the lot to be finished for slaughter. Massive growth of the feedlot industry has provided a boost in demand for the cattle. The expected continuation of feedlot expansion will provide a further expanded market in the future.

This phase of cattle management used to be called "wintering." But the year-around operation of feedlots means that demand is no longer a seasonal one.

Backgrounding may prove to be more profitable to the farmer-feeder than finishing cattle. This maybe especially true where feed storage and other necessary equipment already are available.

For farmer-feeders looking to this project, top-quality silage is a necessity. This means silage with heavy grain content

Youth Need Social Security Cards For Jobs

An estimated 4 million young people in the country will be going to work for the first time this year. Many of them, Charles T. McCoy, Social Security District Manager, said, will be trying out their wings in summer jobs. He reminded young people in the Lancaster area to apply for a social security card before they go job hunting. "You'll need the card to show to your employer," he pointed out, "so that your earnings can be reported to your individual social security account."

The number on a person's social security card is the key to his social security account, he

said. Your earnings during your whole lifetime will be credited to the account set up for you under that number and will be the basis for figuring the benefits payable to you and the family you will someday have.

Mr. McCoy said that many young people may have the mistaken idea that social security is just for old folks. This is not true. Over 22 million disabled workers under 65 are now receiving monthly payments, along with more than 1 million of their dependents. Many of them are under 30 and some are still in their teens.

To get a social security card, stop by the social security office at 225 W. King St. Regular office hours are from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The office is also open each Thursday from 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

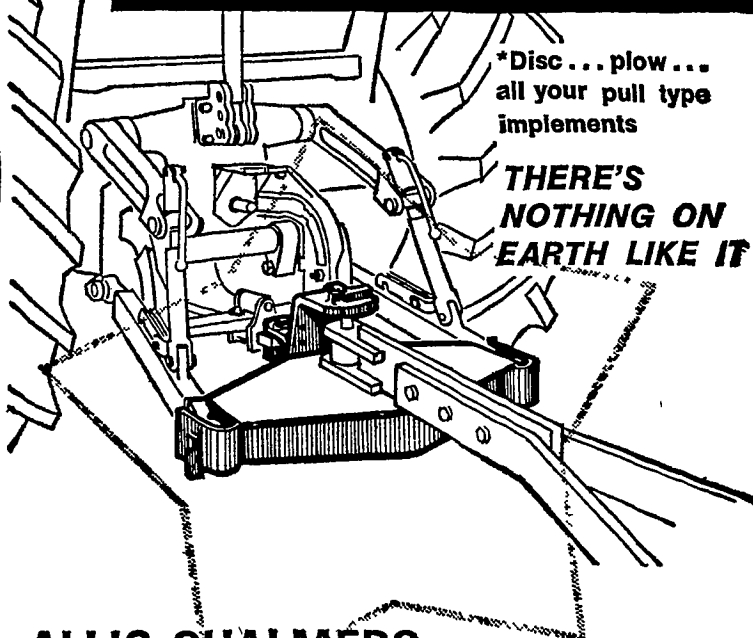
