

Fly Season

The fly season is approaching and many farms will carry heavy infestation. Good fly control begins with a strict sanitation program; the removal of fly breeding places such as

manure, wet straw or feed, or any type of filth is a prerequisite to a fly control program. Box-stalls and pens should be cleaned frequently and the area treated with some fly insecticide such as cygon or diazinon;

these materials will prevent the development of the fly maggots. If fly breeding places are eliminated, there will be fewer flies to combat by other means. The use of residual sprays in the barn is strongly recommended; materials such as cygon, korlan, or rabon should give control, with alternate usage often necessary.

Fungus Disease Damages Trees

The State Agriculture Department today reported that a fungus disease, anthracnose, is damaging sycamore—or button-

wood—trees throughout Pennsylvania. The disease attacks foliage, causing emerging leaves to turn black, as if frosted. As the disease progresses, leaves turn brown and die and infection may spread to small twigs, killing them.

Repeated loss of leaves, the Department pointed out, decreases tree vigor and may result in death of trees. In addition to sycamores, the disease also may attack oak and maple trees.

The condition is most serious in April and May when rain helps spread the infectious agent from leaf to leaf.

The Department's Bureau of Plant Industry says home owners should use three applications of a chemical spray material—zineb 75 percent wettable power—at the rate of one and one-third tablespoons per gallon of water to control the disease. The first application should be made as leaves begin to appear, followed by a second application ten days later and the third application ten days after that.

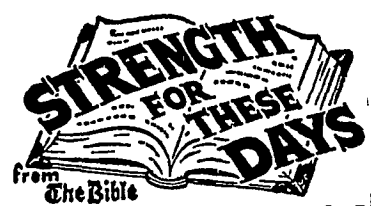

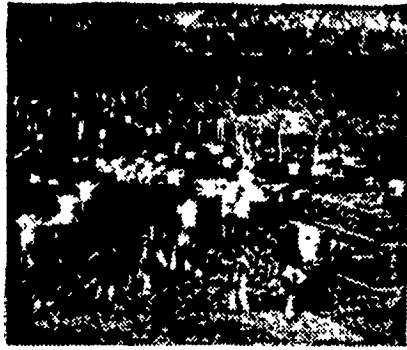
Livestock grazing on fresh, lush pasture will be a common sight in many areas in the coming weeks. Owners are cautioned about the danger of bloating unless the livestock are acclimated to the fresh grass gradually. Continued feeding of some dry matter such as hay or straw is strongly advised. Dairymen must pay attention to the management of their milking cows in order to prevent off-flavored milk; in this case the removal of the cows from the area at least 4 to 5 hours prior to the next milking is recommended. Pastures with wild garlic should be grazed by other livestock than the milk cows. If weather conditions are favorable, and the forage gets ahead of the livestock, then part of the area could be fenced off and this forage cut for hay or silage.
