ize only such exemption as the National Labor Relations Board in its discretion might approve. In addition to his testimony, Shuman presented a supplemental statement in which he reviewed:

—The impact which the enactment of S. 8 would have on farm workers, and consumers and in accelerating the migration of people from rural to urban areas.

—The vulnerability of farmers to labor disputes.

—Recent interpretations of the Labor Management Relations Act by the courts and NLRB which would substantially increase the vulnerability of farmers if S. 8 were enacted—particularly the decisions that a union may fine a member if the member works when the union has called a strike, and that a union may fine a member for exceeding a union established production quota.

—The cost-price squeeze in agriculture

—Current farm wage rates.

—The need to include in any legislative enactment a prohibition of a product boycott.

—The need to include in any legislative enactment governing farmer-worker relations an effective means to prevent "feather-bedding" practices.

—The fallacy of the argument that the extension of the Labor Management Relations Act to agriculture would benefit small farmers.
