Keep Check On Horse

A long gallop on a horse with overlong heel or toe could produce lameness and possibly even permanent injury Inflamation from undue strain can produce splints, ring bones, side bones, founder and other injuries that could become permanent.

It is a good practice to have a vetemaman check your horse's teeth for uneven growth and sharpness Uneven teeth hamper proper grinding and chewing, says James H Gallagh er, extension livestock specialist at The Pennsylvania State Univeisity
