Witness Speaks At Resources Hearing

Samuel Rotrosen, chairman of the Industry Task Force For DDT, testifying as the final industry witness at today's session of the DDT hearings conducted by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, stated that by far the biggest use of DDT in the world today is for the control of malaria and other insect-borne diseases.

Rotrosen, who is president of Montrose Chemical Corporation of California, the largest producer of DDT in the United States, testified that between 70 and 75% of all production of DDT is exported, primarily for public health uses, through the U.S. Public Health Service and the World Health Organization of the United Nations.

He started "Those agencies most concerned with human health, USPHS, and WHO, are completely convinced of the safety of DDT."

Statistics for the latest year available, 1967, show that between 2.5 and 3 million pounds of DDT were used by the Public Health Service for yellow fever control in South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama, Florida, and Texas.

In the United States, by far the largest use is to protect the cotton crop, where DDT is the principal insecticide. Rotrosen declared that DDT has been a major factor in doubling the per-acre yield from the time of its introduction for agricultural use in 1946, down to 1967 (the statistical year cited as most recent).

He testified that DDT usage in the U.S. has declined from the 1963 peak year use of 183 million pounds, to 114 million pounds in 1967.

In tracing his company's 25 years' experience with DDT, and the changing use patterns for the product, he described safety programs conducted in cooperation with public health agencies, as

well as other continuing projects in this field.

Thirty-five of 115 Montrose employees who were heavily exposed to DDT in the course of their work for an average of 14 working years, revealed no ill effects attributable to this exposure. A current study of enzyme induction, if any, is also underway. The California Public Health Service is also checking the health status today of former Montrose employees.

A final boost to DDT, as an effective and safe product, vitally needed for specific purposes, was given by witness Taft Pierce, Regional Vice-President of Orkin Exterminating Company, the largest such organization in the world.

Pierce, Orkin chief for seven midwestern states, including Wisconsin, testified that DDT was the only product approved by the Federal Government for use as a tracking powder for the control of mice, and as a roost
