The Vintage Sales Stables, Inc. held their first feeder cattle show and sale last Friday night with 465 head of feeder steers and bulls sold

Topping the show with two pens of Angus was Roland Sharpless, Quarryville R2 After placing 1st and 2nd in the Angus breed, the Sharpless entries were named champion and reserve champion of the show by judge James Anderson, USDA Market News Reporter. Bought last fall in Culpepper, Va, in a string of 250 head, the champion and reserve champion pens were wintered on silage and Pro-Lix liquid feed. They scaled 750 and 787 pounds when sold

Third place Angus were shown by Weatherfield Farms, Amenia, N Y.

In the Hereford class, Champion pen was shown by Carl B Herr, 840 Penn-Grant Rd, Lancaster, Reserve Champion, Floyd W High, Ephrata, R. #2; third place, Shady Brook Farm, Quarryville, R D

In Crossbreds, Black-white-face steers were shown to the Championship by Weatherfield Farms; Reserve Champions, Carl B. Herr, Charolais crossbreds; third place, Robert M Esbenshade, Paradise R. #1, Black-whiteface steers

The Champion pen of steers scaled 750 lbs and sold for \$34-50 cwt. to Joe Hoover, Myerstown R3 The Reserve Champion weighted 787 lbs, and sold for \$33.00 cwt; third place Angus, 829 lbs, 33 00 cwt

Champion Herefords averaged 857 lbs at \$33 25 cwt; Reserve Champions, 925 lbs at \$33.50 cwt to slaughter; third place, 851 lbs, \$32.75 cwt.

Champion Crossbreds averaged 813 lbs. at \$33.75 cwt; Reserve Champions, 916 lbs. at \$33 75 cwt; third place, 633 lbs. at \$35 00 cwt

The sale lasted only one and one-half hours.

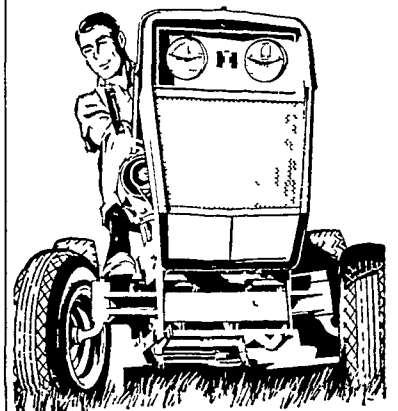

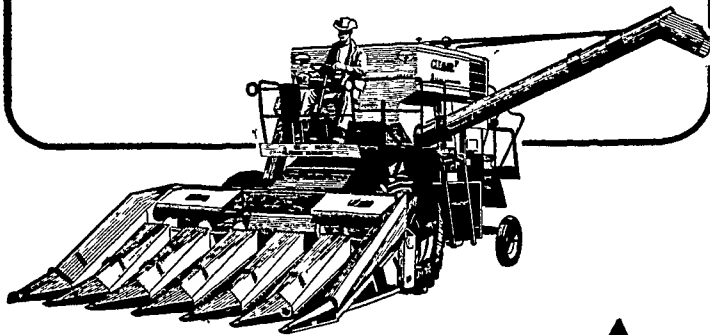
