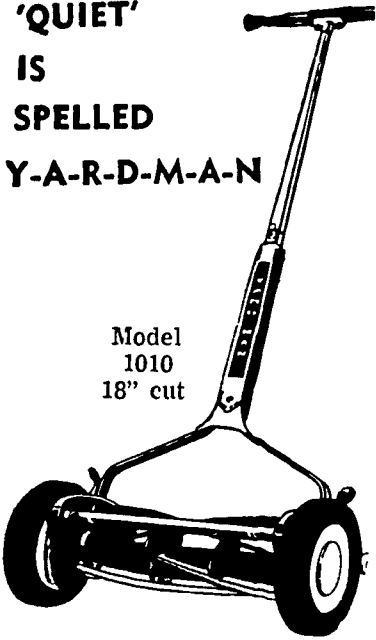

"Selection of the 60 leadership corps delegates was made from among Pennsylvania's 50,000 4-H members on the basis of their achievement records," said Jerry H. Reyburn, assistant State 4-H leader at Penn State, chairman of the event. "All council representatives previously participated in 4-H Congress programs."

Leadership council members will arrive on the Penn State campus June 14 for two days of counseling and orientation to prepare them for their duties the remainder of the week.

Club Congress is designed to develop an appreciation and understanding of national and international problems and to practice leadership and the acceptance of responsibility for independent group actions, the 4-H official emphasized.

Smith, professor of rural sociology in the College of Agriculture; and Mike Reid, defensive tackle for the Penn State football team.

Cooperative Extension Service personnel, including University staff members, county agents, and Extension home economists, will assist with program activities.
