The Women's Activities committee will have a food stand at the Harold Cramer's sale in Quarryville, June 14

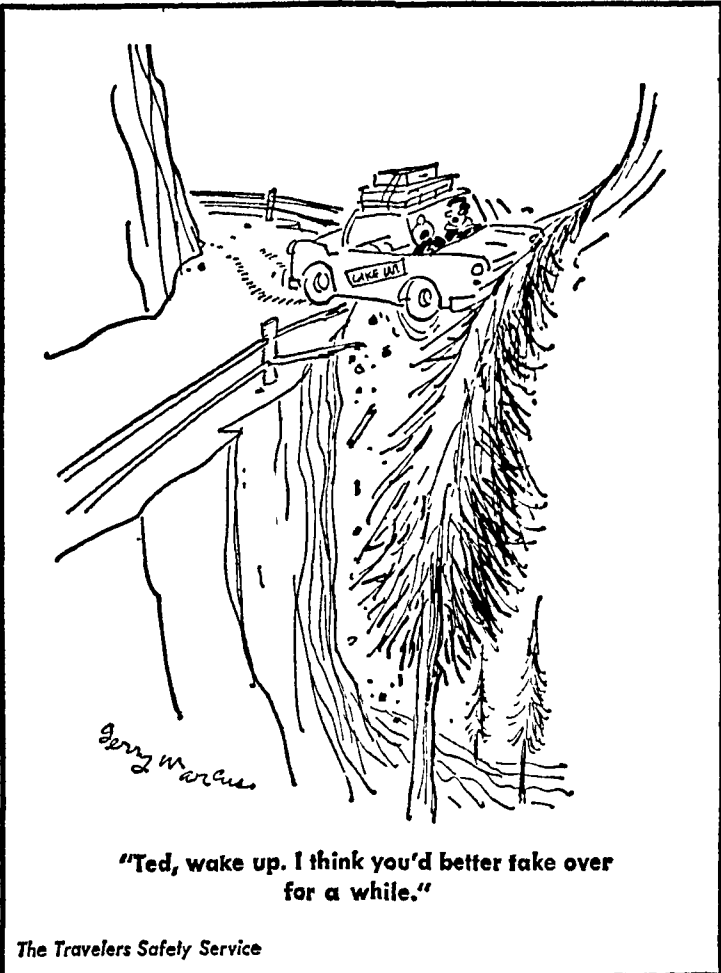
