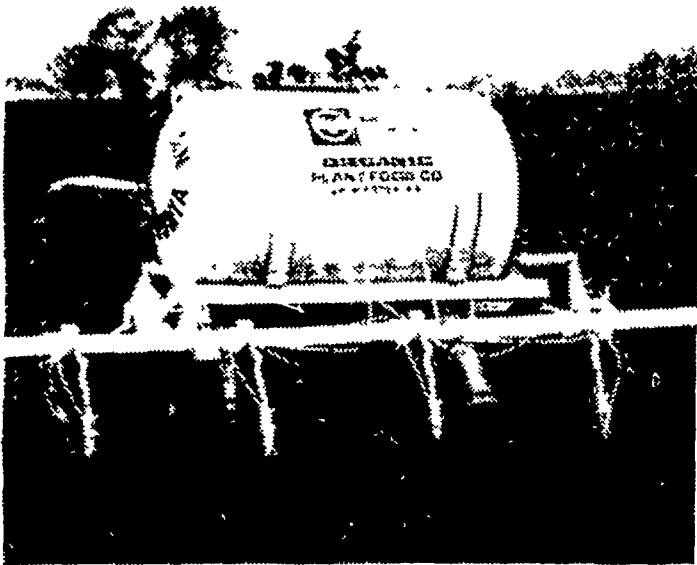
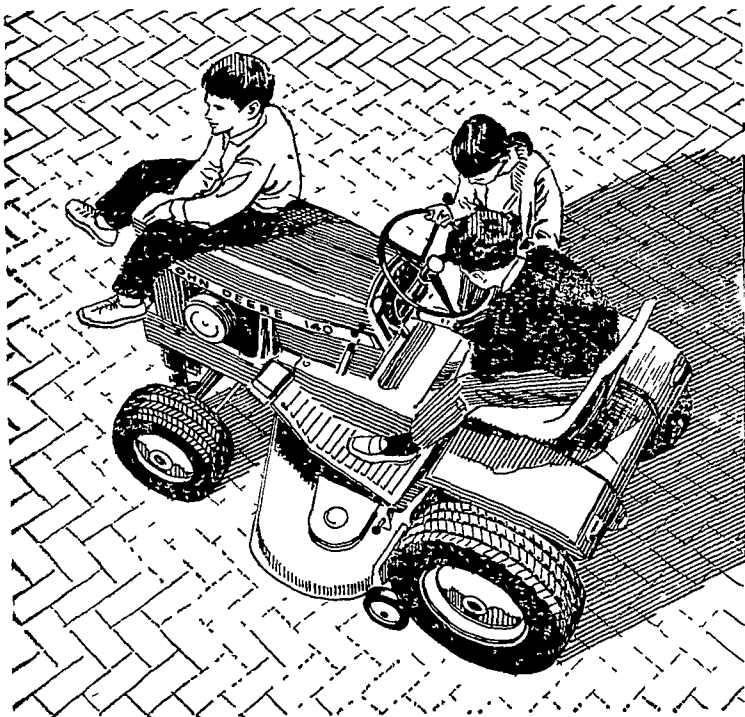

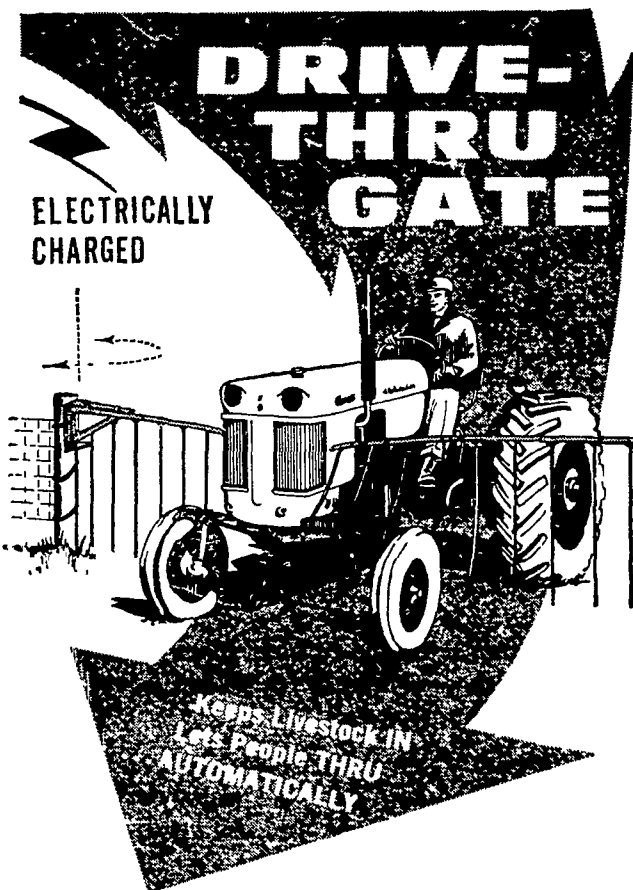

In Lancaster County, the 1969 Dairy Princess Pageant will be held June 24th at 7 p.m. at the Willow Valley Motel, Willow Street. Pa. Rules for the contest . . .

. . . of a dairy-
ing family producing milk in Pa. from five or more cows live in Lancaster County. Pa. be at least 17, and not reach 25 before July 1, '69, be a high school graduate before June 30, 1969; have parents or guardians consent if under 21, be single and never married, appear at local contest, appear at state finals if selected as local contest winner, former local state winners are not eligible, the contestant may not represent more than one local contest.

Prizes will be awarded to all contestants. The 1969 winner will go on to represent Lancaster County in the State Finals to be held in Harrisburg during the week of the All-American Dairy Show in September.

County contestants are urged to compete and the deadline is June 15th.

Tickets will be available after June 1 and may be purchased from the Pageant Committee members.

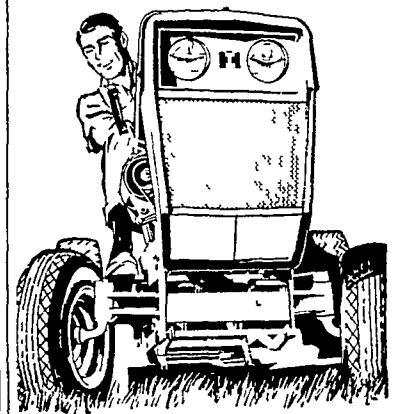
