in their endeavors to improve the breed and to secure recognition for its superior qualities of an owner of pure-bred or

At the time of the formation of the Association, this group also initiated the formation of the Guernsey Calf Club. To this day, the Club is supported in part by them, providing money for the annual 4H Guernsey Round-up.

A Guernsey Field Day is held each year at a farm of one of the members. This year, the location was the farm of K. D. Linde, Quarryville. During the morning, judging activities were available for men, women, and children. During the afternoon, an interesting program including slides of various dairy setups held everyone's attention.

In the fall of the year, another exciting event takes place — this is the presentation of a Guernsey calf to an FFA boy at the Lampeter Community Fair. Each interested member submits his application, telling how he would raise a calf. Each applicant is also interviewed individually. Accordingly, a winner is chosen. This year's winner was Ken Grube.

Since the formation of the Lancaster County Guernsey Breeders Association in 1925, an Annual Banquet and business meeting has been held. The site this year was Rhoads' Restaurant, Quarryville, the menu included delicious fried chicken. Following the recognition of guests and the presentation of several reports and awards, The Rev. George Paterson, D.D. provided entertainment with slides and narration of various countries he had visited.

This spring, instead of a field trip which is usually taken annually, a group from the Association attended the National Guernsey Breeders Association meeting in Hershey, Pennsylvania. This was an opportunity which does not arise frequently, as these meetings are held all over the United States. All those attending enjoyed this chance to see how other areas are attempting to improve and secure recognition of the superior qualities of the Guernsey breed.
