not letting enough dry matter into their stomach. In either case, better get some hay out of the mow and supplement the pasture feed. Feeding hay along with pasture will help that but to get test and the droppings become a little more firm.

The dairy breeding research center is conducting research in an effort to determine the causes and effective treatment of cystic ovaries in cattle. If you have a cow or heifer that has been diagnosed as cystic or has the usual symptoms she might make a valuable contribution to this research. This research center will pick the animals up at your farm and pay 2c per pound over current beef prices. The center also needs pregnant Guernsey cows or heifers. If you should have one (any stage of pregnancy) that you plan to move out of the herd, you are asked to contact the Research Center by phone (collect) or letter. Address: Dr. T. V. 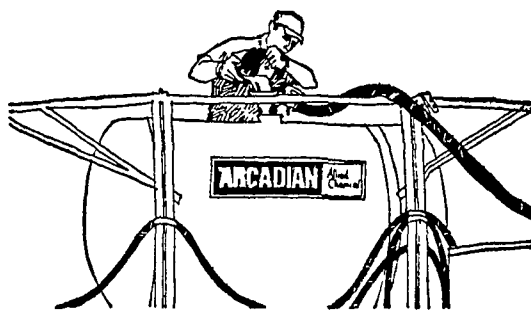

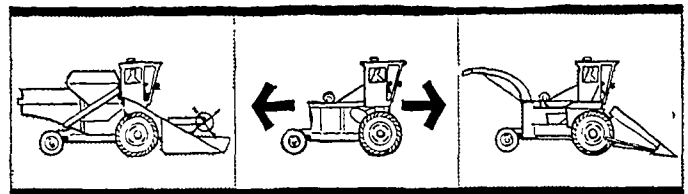
