# Peach Growers Veto Ad Funds Request

**HARRISBURG** — Pennsylvania peach growers voted Tuesday against a self-assessment plan to raise funds for advertising and promoting peaches.

The plan was defeated even though the "yes" votes (67) were greater than the "no" votes (51). State law requires that 66% of those voting favor the assessment "Yes" votes totaled 56.8 percent of those casting ballots.

The proposed assessment was three cents a hundredweight for fresh market peaches.

Voting was done through ballots which had been mailed to growers. The ballots were returned to the State Agriculture Building where they were counted by Paul McPherson, New Park; George Unger, New Berlinville; John F. Peters, Gardners; and Earl Strite, Harrisburg. 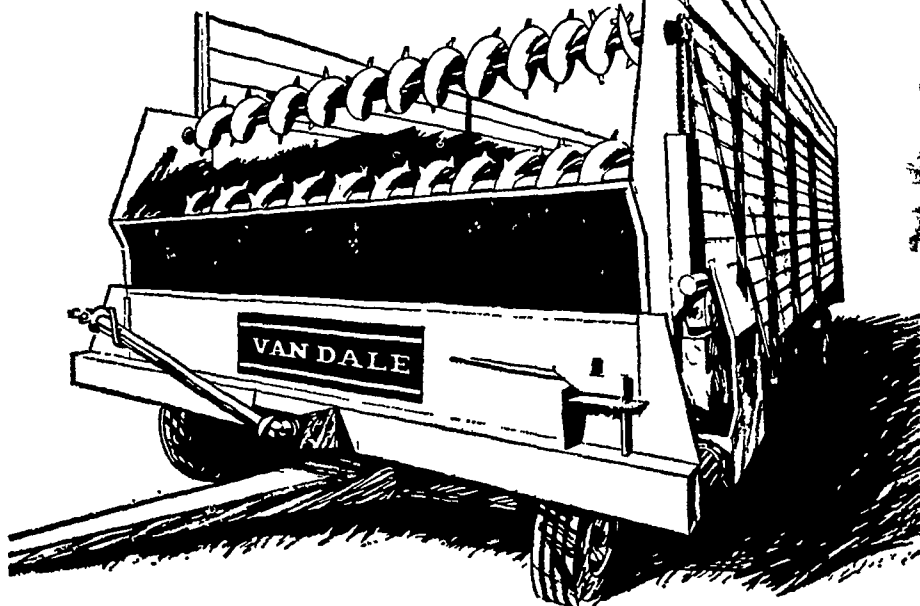
