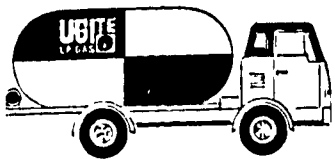
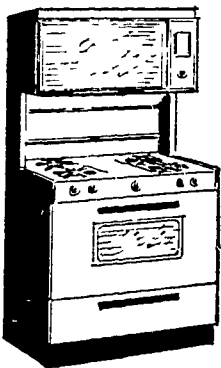

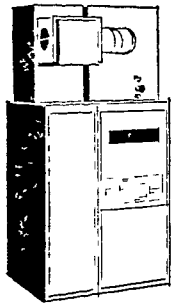

Devotions were conducted by Mrs. Charles Leaman. A special feature of the day was a tribute to fathers.

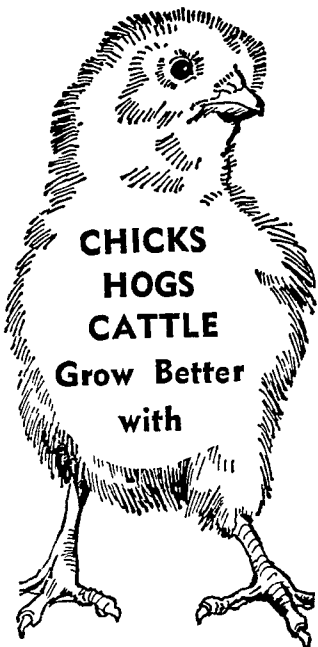

### Pennsylvania Broiler Placements Up 8%

Placements of broiler chicks in the Commonwealth during the week ending June 14 was 927,000. The placements were 8% above the same week a year earlier but 8% below the previous week. Average placements during the past 10 weeks were 9% above a year earlier. Settings for broiler chicks were 1,719,000—4% below the previous week but 10% above the comparable period a year earlier. The current 3-week total of eggs set is 7% above the same period a year ago. Inshipments of boiler-type chicks during the past 10 weeks averaged 44,000—three times the comparable period a year ago. Outshipments averaged 340,000 during the past 10 weeks, 28% higher than a year earlier.



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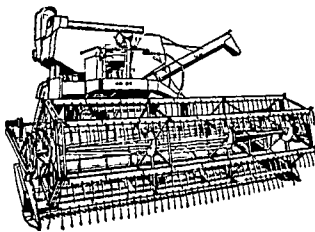
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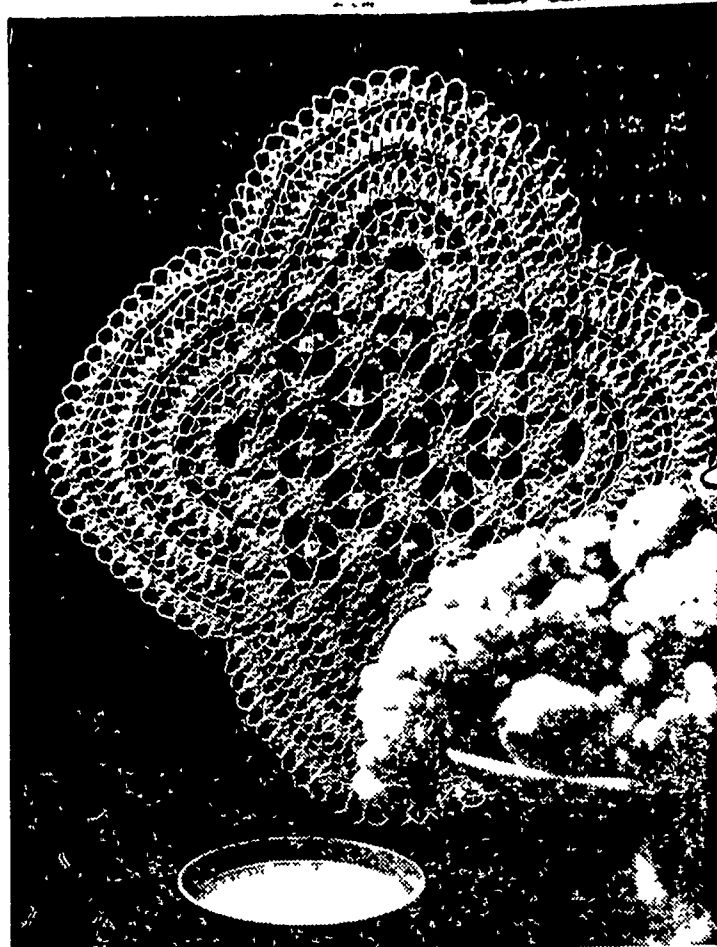
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### SOLANCO FFA NEWS
