the last half of 1969, compared to a year earlier, would tend to impart strength to broiler demand However the effect of less turkey will be offset by increased supplies of poik

The demand for red meats and broilers has been unusually strong in recent months with in creased supplies selling for prices substantially above year earl ier levels There is considerable danger that favorable prices will result in substantial increases in the production of these products A simultaneous weakening in demand would severly depress prices until production was cu back Measures taken to control inflation are expected to soften




