lion acres of allotment on participating farms reflects a national average income of 62 cents on each bushel produced by cooperators, as compared to 55 cents on eligible 1968 crop wheat.

The Chairman further explained that an individual farmer participating in the wheat program can determine his total return per bushel for wheat by dividing his certificate payment by his total production to get an average per bushel payment. By adding this to the price they receive in the market, participants in the program find their total return per bushel

**First-Time Hunters**

Future hunters under 16 years of age, will be required to complete a hunter safety training program before they can buy a hunting license. This new requirement becomes effective September 1. Dagenhardt, for "Buttons and Bows."

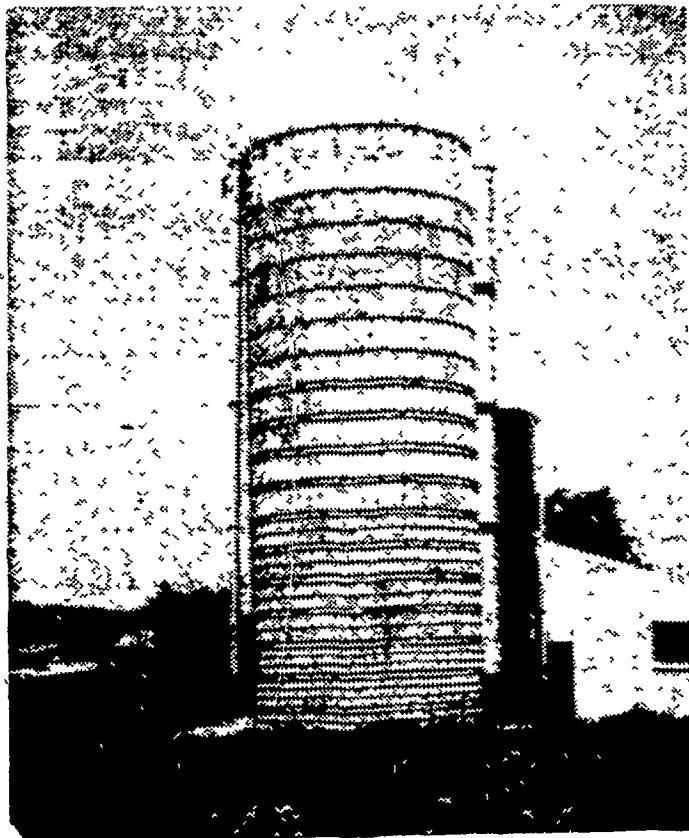
In the junior division, Robin King will compete for her project "Nifty Gifts"

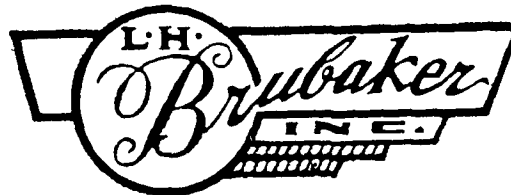

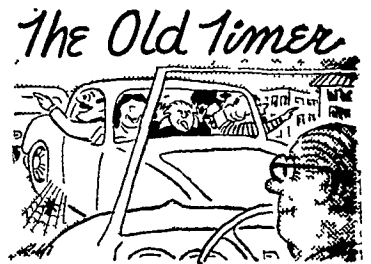

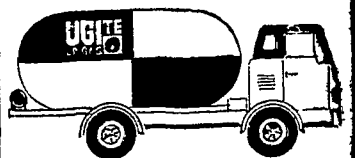
