**Seed Supplies**

The practice of ordering seed supplies several months before they are needed is a good practice. The summer seeding of alfalfa should be made early in August and winter oats should go into the ground in about 8 weeks, followed by winter barley and wheat. Highest yields may be attained by planting certified seeds of adapted varieties of these crops. Some supplies of these popular varieties may not meet the demand and the farmer will have to take some unknown kind. Growers are urged to place their orders early for these seeds in order to get what is wanted. The costs of planting and harvesting will be the same on an unknown variety as on the best adapted variety that is available. Our Extension Agronomy Guide may be of help in selecting good varieties and is available without cost.

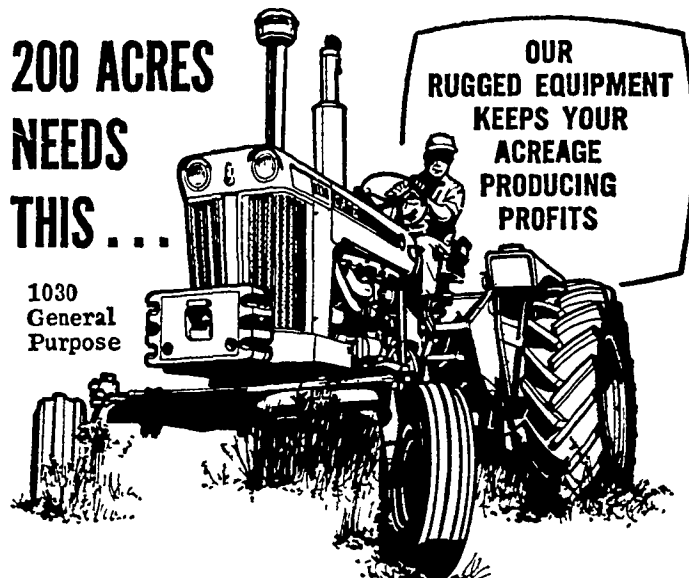
**King Arthur's Sword**
