including means and methods of promoting the use and sale of milk.

Should the assessment plan be voted in, state law requires the State Agriculture Secretary call a referendum every three years to see if the majority of milk producers still desire the assessment plan and marketing program.

A View From The Governor's Office

A six-point program to prevent and control stream pollution caused by highway construction throughout Pennsylvania has been initiated by our Departments of Highways and Mines and Mineral Industries.

The agreement was worked out at a meeting of those De-

partments along with a representative of the Department of Forests and Waters and is in addition to similar existing agreements with other State conservation agencies.

Throughout this Administration, the Department of Highways has cooperated closely with the Department of Forests and Waters and the Fish and Game Commissions in planning and building new highways without unnecessary destruction of any of our natural resources.

Recent disclosures that construction of a part of Interstate 80 through a restored Clarion County strip mine area four years ago resulted in pollution of Beaver Creek make it imperative that this kind of disaster be prevented in the future.

I am certain that the agreement will not only prevent stream pollution by acid mine drainage in the future but result in early correction of the existing situation.

Highway construction without destruction of any of our natural resources will continue to be a major goal of this Administration's conservation policy.

Major changes in operational procedures include:

— Close cooperation in planning and constructing highways through mining areas.

— An action program to prevent and eliminate water pollution from acid mine drainage where highways already have been built.

— A new research program aimed at stream protection where coal seams are currently exposed to highway travelers.

Specifically, the agreement, similar in content to those now in existence between the Department of Highways and Forests and Waters and the Fish and Game Commission, calls for:

1. The Department of Highways will emphasize in its design standards specific requirements suggested by Mines and Mineral Industries to assure maximum stream protection from acidity and water pollution. The Department of Mines will also furnish technical assistance and appropriation recommendations.

2. Both Departments will cooperate on suitable research

and corrective action program to restore the natural environment and correct any existing stream pollution caused by past highway construction.

3. The Mines and Mineral Industries Department will consider acquisition of lands along rights-of-way adjacent to certain highways for restoration programs to improve these scenic vistas and recreational potential.

4. Mines and Mineral Industries personnel will attend all public hearings concerning proposed route locations to testify regarding reclamation, restoration and clean streams preservation activities.

5. The Department of Highways will keep the Mines and Mineral Industries Department fully apprised of long-range highway construction plans so as to achieve a closer working relationship involving matters of conservation and prevention of stream pollution in known mining areas.

6. Highway engineers and mining personnel will meet this week to determine appropriate actions in the Beaver Creek area along Interstate 80 in Clarion County to control and/or eliminate stream contamination.

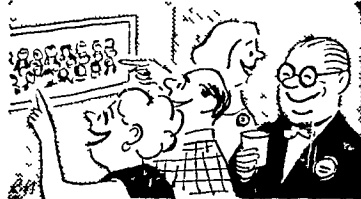
