CATTLE—Compared with close last week, Slaughter Steers 100-150 lower, the most decline on high Choice and Prime Heifers 1.00-1.25 lower, Cows 50 higher. Bull, steady.

Local receipts included 72 percent Slaughter Steers and 24 percent Heifers, The balance mostly Cows. Overall finish of Slaughter Steers 21 percent Prime and 69 percent Choice compared with 26 percent Prime and 63 percent Choice last week and 15 percent Prime 73 percent Choice last year. Average cost and weight of Slaughter Steers estimated at 33 20 and 1180 lbs, compared (Continued on Page 3)
