Chicago Cattle Weekly Review

CATTLE — Compared with last Friday, slaughter steers 1 00-1 50 lower, the most decline on weights over 1150 lbs Slaughter heifers 1 25-1 50 lower, Cows 25-50 higher Bulls steady.

Receipts included 74 percent slaughter steers and 22 percent heifers with the balance mostly slaughter cows. Overall finish slaughter steers 23 percent Prime and 64 percent Choice last week, and 13 percent Prime and 73 percent Choice last year. Average cost and weight of slaughter steers, estimated at 31, 90 and 1170 lbs, compared with 33.05 and 1169 lbs. last week and 27.58 and 1192 lbs. last year. Heifer supply mostly High Good to Low Prime weighing 800-1050 lbs.
