Demand continues good in most sections, however more aggressiveness noted in Pennsylvania than in New Jersey, as processors find it often necessary to store dressed product during heavy vegetable canning period. Offerings are barely adequate to short of buyer interest. Heavy hens continue short of a fairly good call which is being filled outside the area. Prices paid at the farm: Light type 8-10 3/4, mostly 10-10 1/4 in Pennsylvania and 8 1/2-9 in New Jersey.
