

Yost To Represent Agway At Institute

Mr. and Mrs. Ivan R. Yost, Christiansburg, Pa., Pennsylvania, have been selected by Agway Inc. to attend the 1969 Annual Meeting of the American Institute of Cooperation at the University of Illinois, Urbana, Illinois, August 3-7.

The Yosts, one of four young farm couples who will represent Agway's total distribution system, will participate in the young farmers and their wives program at the conference. They were chosen from the Southern Division which comprises all of New Jersey, Delaware, Eastern Pennsylvania and Northern and Eastern Shore Maryland. Their selection was jointly announced by Lester M. Shughart, Southern Division Manager and Raymond Cochran, Area Manager.

The American Institute of Cooperation is the educational organization serving all farmer cooperatives in this country. It is supported through voluntary annual dues paid by about 3,000 farmer cooperatives.

One of the chief aims of the conference is to offer opportunities for further development of young leaders through association with other young farmers, youth scholars, as well as local, state and national leaders in agriculture, education, government, industry, civic organizations, and cooperatives.

The entire session is organized to bring out the best thinking available in America, to exchange ideas and to stimulate action. Throughout this conference, the participants will discuss vital subjects concerning
