## Chicago Cattle Weekly Review

**CATTLE**—Compared with last Friday, High Choice and Prime Slaughter Steers 1.25-1.75 higher. Average Choice and below 50-1.25 higher Slaughter Heifers 50 to fully 1.00 higher. Cows 50-1.00 higher Bulls steady.

Local receipts 70 percent Slaughter Steers, 25 percent Heifers, balance mostly cows. Overall finish Slaughter Steers 16 percent Prime, the lowest in two months, and 70 percent Choice, compared with 22 percent Prime and 67 percent Choice last week, and 14 percent Prime and 72 percent Choice last year. Average cost and weight Slaughter Steer estimated at 29.90 and 1150 lbs., compared with 30.74 and 1152 lbs. (Continued on Page 3)
