and separates into large flakes. It is attractive in salads and recipes calling for salmon in large pieces

Sockeye or red salmon has deep red meat and considerable oil. It has a firm texture and breaks into smaller flakes which makes it attractive for hot dishes and salads.

Pink salmon is small flaked and ranges from light to deep pink. This is a thrifty buy for main dishes, soups, chowders and sandwiches.

Chum or Keta salmon is large flaked, very light in color, low in oil and is especially suitable for cooked dishes where color isn't important. This is the least expensive of the salmon

Center-Hinged Doors and Safety Features

Changing cupboard doors to center-hinged doors will reduce the number of head bumps and reduce the safety hazard in your kitchen.

To make a cabinet door that folds back, rather than swings out, cut it in two, lengthwise down the center

Then install flat hinges on the inside of the door. These hinges will hold the two sections together.

When you open the door, it will fold in the center and take up half the space it originally did.

When you close it, the door will shut flat and latch the same as it did when it was in one piece.

You can reHINGE doors of plywood, fiberboard or solid wood.

If you're a do-it-yourself enthusiast and have a power saw that makes a neat, even cut, you can change your own cabinet doors.

If you find center-hinged cabinet doors handy, you can make your closet doors the same way.

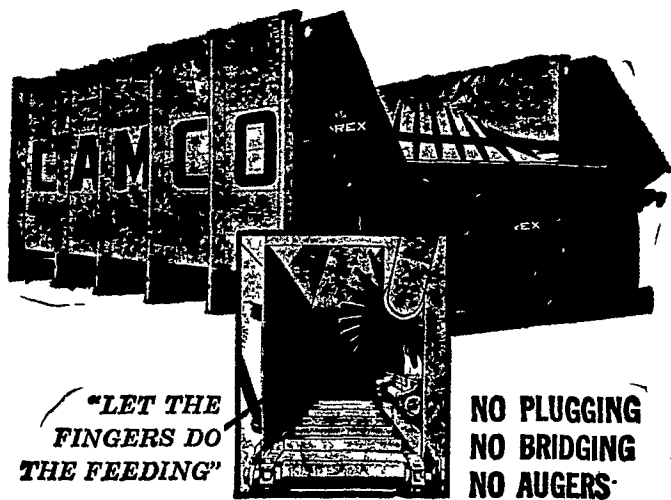
