The value of mu c'i ng around garden and ornamental plants -hould be rerozn zed at this time of the year Due to adequate rainfall in recent weeks in most parts of the county, now would be a good time to apply the mulch in order to maintain this moisture for the balance of the summer This is especially true in new plantings where the soil has been disturbed this growing season Mulch not only conserves moisture, but eliminates the weeding problem Materials such es peat moss, tan bark, 10tten sawdust, pebbles, or lawn clippings may be used however, the mulch should not be placed against oi namental plants, leave several inches of open space around the shrub or tree trunk.
