## Eastern Pennsylvania And New Jersey

Prices for light type hens continued to hold about unchanged, however occasional unconfirmed reports indicate limited sales slightly above the range. Demand continues good as processors attempt to maintain operations as near capacity as possible. Offerings about steady despite sharply lower prevailing egg prices. Demand continues good for limited offerings of heavy type hens. Prices paid at farm: Light Type Hens: 8-11 10-10½c in Pennsylvania; mostly 9½-10c in New Jersey. Heavy Type Hens: 7fwer.

August and September are two good months to apply lime on many fields. For land that is to be seeded to legumes in 1970, now is the time to get started to correct the acidity for it takes time for lime to work; when it is well mixed into the soil it will do a much better and faster job. Sod that is to be plowed down in 1970 and needs lime, may be limed this fall because this lime will be well mixed with the soil when the soil is turned again for the 1971 small grain crop to be seeded down. Most fields are in much better condition for heavy trucks during late summer than in early spring. A soil test will determine the amount of lime that is needed. Don't guess.
