Local Eggs

er in Lititz, 140 cases of extra-high quality eggs have been ordered for the Voyage through a Philadelphia broker. "These eggs," Gehman said, "must meet a 90 percent double A standard, five percent above the standard set by USDA for this quality egg. We are going to try to have them even at a higher level if possible," he said. "This can only be done if the eggs are constantly refrigerated from the nest."

The eggs at the local plant are scheduled to be inspected on Monday and plans call for the shipment to leave via Sauder's trucks on Tuesday for the dock.

The crew has been asked to bring personal belongings for a three-month voyage, so it is easily seen why the standard for the local eggs is so high.

Humble will issue each man on the crew, a specially designed parka, mittens and sunglasses. They will also receive the expedition patch, a tradition long established by past Polar explorers. The patch portrays the Humble "tiger" outfitted with earmuffs, now making him, as one crew member said, an "arctic tiger".

Although tanker masters never allow firearms on their ships, they will be taken on this unusual voyage. Ice research parties, flown by helicopter out on the ice to make core samples,

will need the weapons for protection from polar bears.

An elaborate communication system, 500 times more powerful than standard ship equipment, has been installed on the Manhattan to overcome poor communication conditions in the Polar region. It will assure a highly reliable link with headquarters in Houston.

Approximately 4,800 people have become involved in this latest challenge to the Northwest Passage. Naturally, the local firm in Lititz is elated to have been selected to supply the eggs for the voyage.
