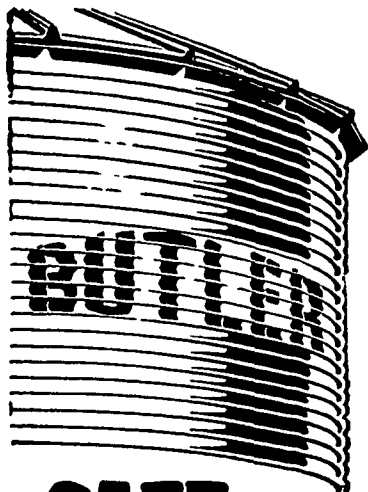

against the corn borer then carbaryl EPN is a highly toxic organophosphate insecticide which must be handled with the same precautions as parathion. A tolerance of 3 ppm (parts per million) has been established by FDA. EPN can be used within 14 days of harvest; after this waiting period the fodder can be fed animals EPN is highly toxic to bees. READ THE LABEL.

Corn Earworm

Light traps catches of corn earworm adults indicate continued buildup and possible heavy infestations in some fields. Significant moth flights occurred on August 5, 6, 7 and August 12 and 13.

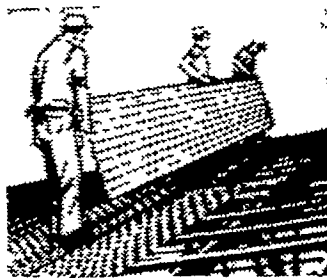
