

Hurricane Damage On Farms Estimated

First estimates indicate more than \$8 million in disaster loans will be needed in four states to restore rural homes and farms damaged by hurricane Camille. James V. Smith, Administrator of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Farmers Home Administration said this week.

Mississippi will require at least \$7 million in emergency farm credit, with an additional \$650,000 needed in Virginia, \$500,000 in Louisiana, and \$100,000 in West Virginia, Smith estimated. Housing credit needs — particularly in Mississippi and Virginia — will not be fully determined until insurance claims have been settled, Mr. Smith said.

Secretary of Agriculture Clifford Hardin has designated 33 Mississippi counties, 25 Virginia counties, 4 Louisiana parishes and one West Virginia county as disaster areas, making people in communities of 5,500 and under in these areas eligible for 3 percent disaster loans to restore homes and farm operations if they are unable to obtain credit elsewhere.

Smith said the Farmers Home Administration is cooperating with the Federal Housing Administration and Small Business Administration to determine how each agency will help to deal with housing credit needs in the disaster areas.

In rural Mississippi, housing was extensively damaged by winds although relatively few homes were destroyed in counties inland from the Gulf Coast

front Farmers Home county offices have accepted about 120 loan applications to restore damaged homes in counties hardest hit on or near the Gulf Coast, and indications are that the agency will receive 200 to 300 more applications in this area, Smith reported.

In Virginia, he said, housing credit also remains to be clarified.

A massive rainstorm when it reached Virginia, Camille unleashed floods and landslides that took a heavy toll of lives and property in the rural James River Basin. Virginia's death toll is estimated at more than 170 people.

"In some of the devastated communities they are just beginning to think about reconstruction," Smith said. "In places where landslides buried valley settlements, it appears that some surviving families will have to relocate instead of trying to rebuild on their now obliterated homesites."

The Administrator said Farmers Home Administration staff members have completed automobile tours of remote communities in Virginia where, for (Continued on Page 10)
