**Governor Emphasizes Pa. Hunting Safety**

The period September 1 — January 10 has been designated "Hunt Safely in Pennsylvania Time" by Governor Raymond P. Shafer.

The state's chief executive noted that hunting offers outdoor recreation for over one million Pennsylvania residents and some 90,000 non-residents who are demanding even greater opportunities for the wholesome enjoyment of the commonwealth's abundant wildlife resources.

Although sportsmen are usually conscious of their obligations and have compiled a record which makes hunting one of the safest of all forms of recreation, accidents occur.

The governor asks that sports-

men review safe gun handling procedures and become better trained and informed on safety precautions so that all may do their utmost toward reducing hunting accidents in the state.

Pennsylvania has been internationally recognized for its efforts in hunter safety, and the governor urges all sportsmen and hunter safety instructors to continue to promote the state's fine program aimed at eliminating mishaps.

Again the Game Commission stresses that one of the most effective means in reducing accidents is wearing clothing of a fluorescent orange material.
