Local Breeders Shut Out At State Show

Lancaster County Holstein breeders were shut out of all championships Tuesday, at the Pennsylvania State Black and White Show in Harrisburg. Running into huge classes (some including 80 entries) with quality going deep into the class the highest local breeders could go was second place.

Clarence Stauffer, Ephrata R1 had the second place junior yearling bull with Sunny Craft Jim Monogram and Galen W. Crouse Stevens R1 showed the second place senior yearling bull with Len Lyn Model Kingpin Max.

Miss Ivanhoe Scranton shown by Raymond Seidel, Richland took the senior and grand championship and was named the best udder winner of the show. The Ivanhoe daughter was the first aged cow in milk.

Following the Miss cow to reserve champion was the second place aged cow in milk, Alnat Totilla Ivanhoe Ginger, shown by Allen Dairy Farm Mechanicsburg R2. She was also an Ivanhoe daughter.

Locally, the only other placings that could be called top were in the Intermediate Heifer Calf Class when Penn Springs Bill Maid was third for Robert Kauffman, Elizabethtown R1 and in the Junior Yearling Class when Lockway Fultonway Teresa was third for J. Mowley Frey Jr, Lancaster.

In the Premier Breeder award presentation, Earl Noel, McShenystown was top and George Knight Anville was the Premier Exhibitor.

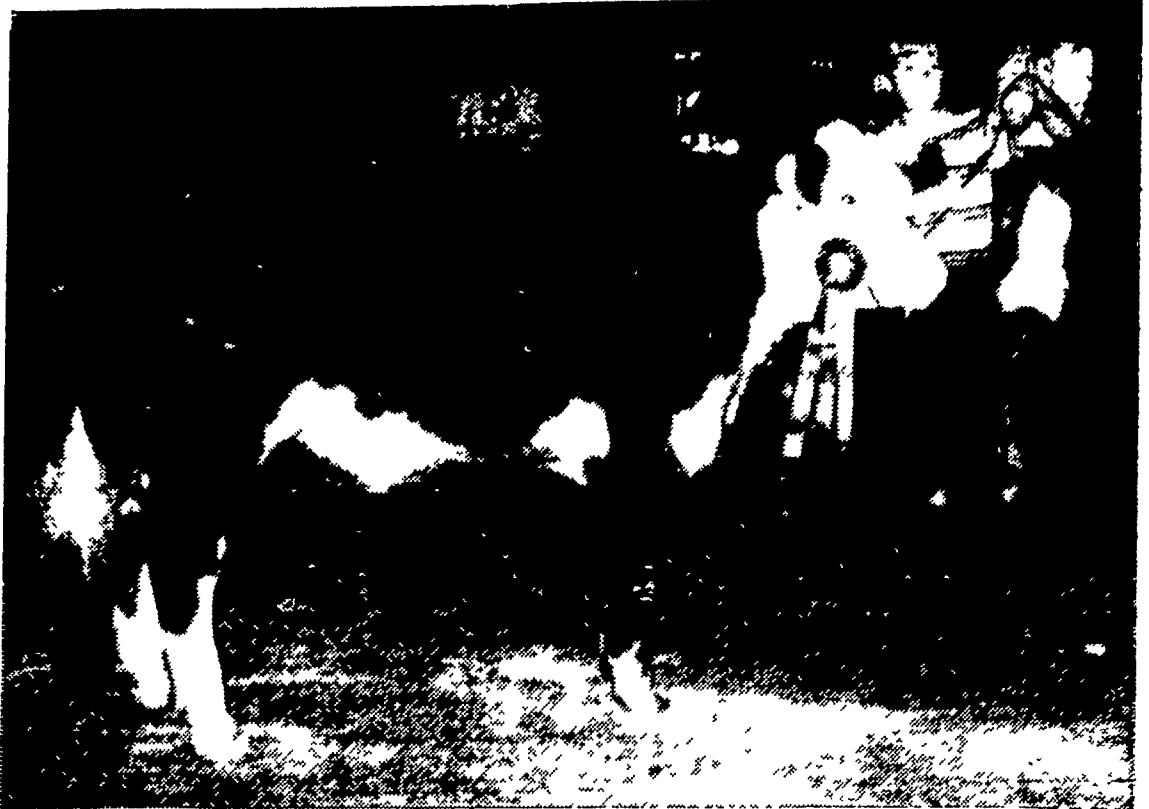
