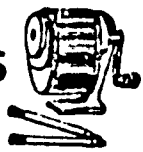

trying to clear moisture out of a room all at one time.

Tips On Caring For Woodenware

Never soak in water. Store in a dry place. Clean in lukewarm suds after use, rinse in clear water and thoroughly dry immediately.

Discard woodenware that is cracked because as with porcelain or pottery dishes cracks can be a breeding place for germs.

Remove surface stains on salad bowls or carving boards by light rubbing, along the grain, with a soapy, steel-wool pad. Rinse with clear water.

To repair the interior of a salad bowl which has become worn, remove the old finish with sandpaper, then rub the bowl with a mixture of powdered pumice until the wood feels dry and smooth. Let dry for 24 hours and repeat the process until you get the luster you want.

production and live hog marketing 60 sow herds (or larger) with year-round farrowing are needed for a substantial income. Year-round farrowing has several advantages. Buildings and equipment are kept in constant use. Full-time labor is employed. Marketing is orderly — hogs are sold at regular intervals — and buyers come to rely on a steady supply.

The disadvantages? Feeds are needed in large quantity. Diseases come to be constant threats. Buildings with environmental control — heat, ventilating, humidity — are needed.

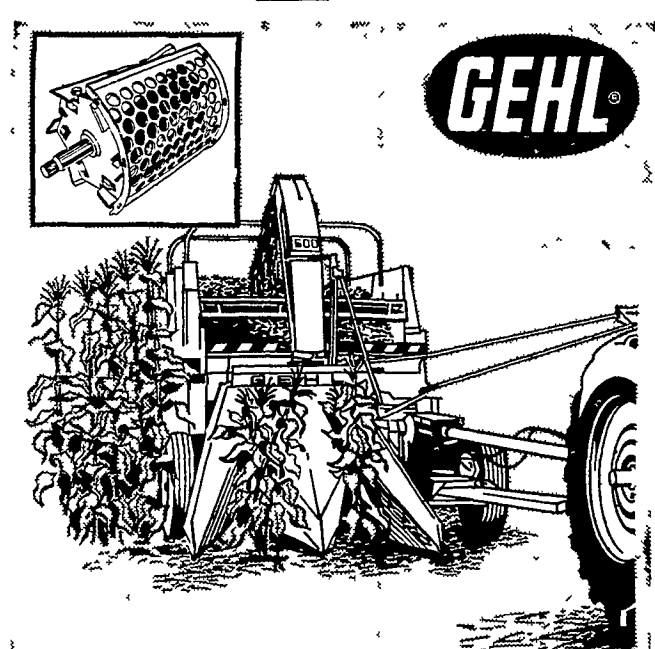

FREY FREE STALL

Lifetime Free Stall Housing



Cut bedding costs 75%, reduce labor for barn cleaning and cow washing; reduce teat and udder injury to the minimum — house your milking herd in free stall housing. Each cow provided a stall for loafing. She won't be stepped on, the rear curb forces manure out into alley for mechanical cleaning or washing. A few minutes twice a day cleans the stalls and curbs, bedding lasts almost forever if your stalls fit the cows. Popular sizes are 6'6", 7' and 7'6". Size 'em by breed.

Our free stall partition may be mounted on wooden head boards or we make a steel divider. Set the legs in 8 to 10" concrete curbs to hold and retain bedding. Stall floor can be soil, sand or gravel. Bedding — straw, sawdust, peanut hulls, ground corn cobs, etc. Should be installed with paved alley surface 8 feet wide for mechanical cleaning or washing.
