Paul Turek, Supervisor of the Penna Random Sample Test presented a slide and tape recording of a proposed promotional program for the Northeast. This material was developed in New York State and it is hoped that 11 states will support it and put it into effect.

Paul also presented a slide and tape recording on Buttons. His wife is a collector and one has no idea of the ramification of buttons, until they see this colorful presentation. Buttons that are just buttons, valuable buttons and buttons of every description from all over the world were colorfully displayed on slides.

Sam Beisenon reporting on Legislation spent all of his time explaining that the entire industry must act at once to support Senate Bill 847.

This bill will change the Bureau of Markets law by deleting a clause which permits out-of-state producers and packers to ship consumer packages into Pennsylvania with grade and size markings but the law does not permit enforcement agents to force compliance.

Following a general discussion, the group adjourned at approximately 10:30 p.m.

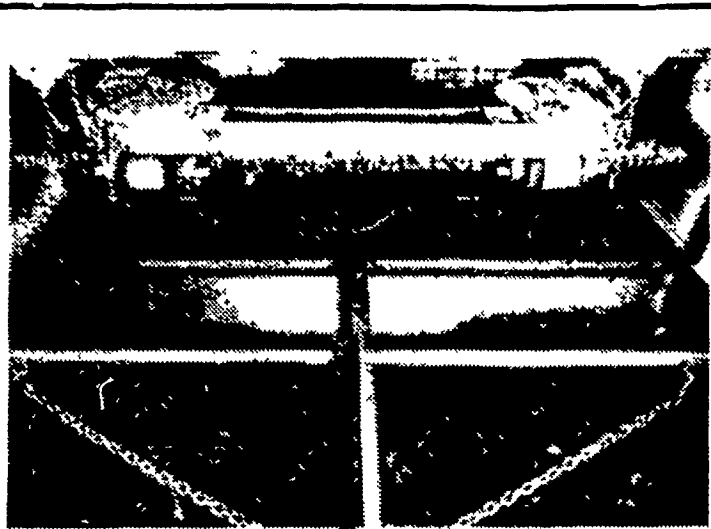
Pa. Livestock Exposition Is November 8 to 15

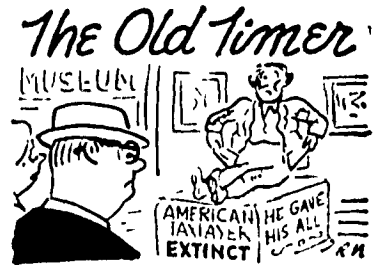
have been offered in the various classes of competition in this special show.

through Saturday, Nov. 15, with the Pennsylvania State 4-H Horse Show.

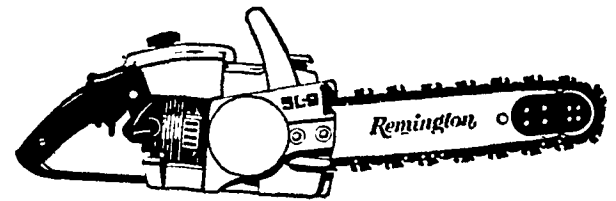
