exposition that opened Tues., the proceeds to be turned over to the National Poultry Research Foundation.

7. The Board voted to invite the Southeastern Poultry and

Egg Association and the Pacific Dairy and Poultry Association to a joint meeting in Washington, D C, next spring.

8 The Board requested Executive Director Richard I Ammon to investigate the possibility of re-establishing periodic meetings of the secretaries

of the affiliated state poultry associations

9 The Board voted to hold the third New England Poultry Conference in the New England area next spring

10. Following lively discussion, President Albert J. Russo instructed the Executive Director

to confer with the proper officials of the U S Department of Agriculture about the serious problems poultry dressing plants in New England are having with resident inspectors, and urge action to solve these problems.

On the score of future growth, Harms' predictions took on a more optimistic tone — particularly where broilers and turkeys were concerned

Chicken is the big meat of the future, he told his audience. Turkey also has a good future, although not as swinging as broilers But as for the future of eggs That, largely, is up to the industry but eggs basically look like a no growth deal on the demand side at this point

Harms predicted that chicken consumption will top 9½ billion pounds, probably to 10 billion by 1975 He expects consumption to be 25 to 30% above current levels by 1975 and perhaps as much as 50% by 1980

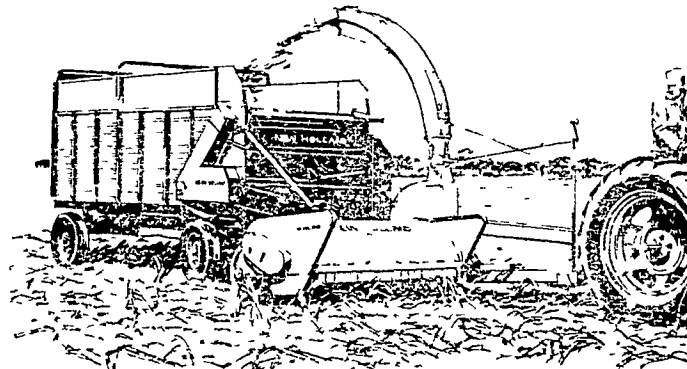

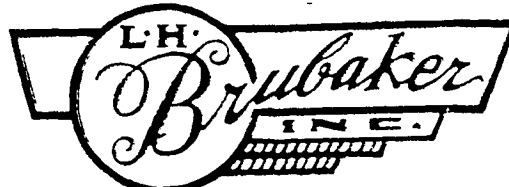
