On the score of future growth, Haims' predictions took on a more optimistic tone --- particularly where broilers and turkeys were concerned

Chicken is the big meat of the future, he told his audience. Turkey also has a good future, although not as swinging as broilers But as for the future of eggs That, largely, is up to the industry but eggs basically look like a no growth deal on the demand side at this point

Harms predicted that chicken consumption will top 91/2 billion pounds, probably to 10 billion by 1975 He expects consumption to be 25 to 30% above current levels by 1975 and perhaps as much as 50' by 1980


