### Small Game Season To Open November 1

Pennsylvania's regular small game season will open on Saturday, November 1, at 9 a.m. EST.

Game Commission Executive Director Glenn L. Bowers cautions all hunters to observe the opening hour on November 1. The entire state will be operating on Eastern Standard Time, so there should be no confusion on the 9 a.m. starting time.

Species which will become legal targets on November 1 include cottontail rabbits, male ringneck pheasants, wild turkeys and bobwhite quail. The early small game season for grouse and squirrels opened October 18.

The seasons for all of these species, except turkeys, will continue through November 29. Turkey season ends on November 27 in the northcentral part of the state and on November 15 in the remainder of the commonwealth.

All pre-season reports indicate there will be an adequate supply of all small game species.

Bowers reminds hunters that

NO wild birds or wild animals, including migratory birds, may be hunted before 9 a.m. on November 1 anywhere in Pennsylvania. Shooting ends at sunset daily.

**Ringneck Pheasants**—The daily limit is two, with a season limit of eight (males only).

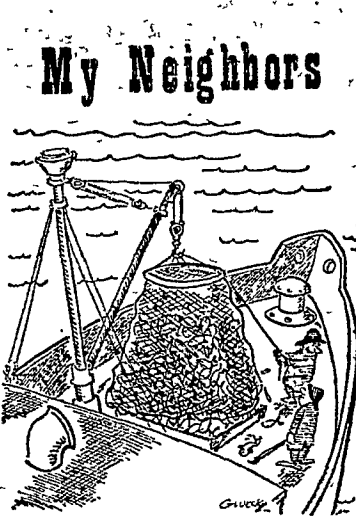
**Wild Turkey**—A limit of one per hunter per hunting license year.

**Bobwhite Quail**—A limit of four per day and twenty per season.

**Ruffed Grouse**—The daily limit is two, with not more than ten in combined seasons.

**Squirrels**—Six per day, and not more than thirty in combined seasons.

A winter season for cottontail rabbits, squirrels and grouse will open on December 26 and close on January 10.

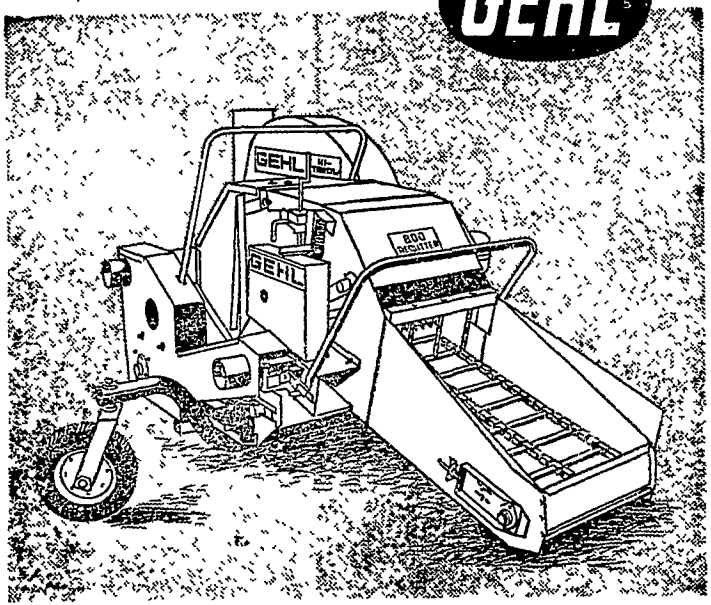
