

A View From The Governor's Office

Just last week, 21,000 young Pennsylvanians who make up my Youth Advisory Council recommended that young people be given an immediate voice in governmental policy decisions affecting their daily lives.

I agreed — and so this week, my Administration is now preparing recommendations for the appointment of young advisors to The State Board of Education, the Boards of Trustees of the 13 State owned colleges and Pennsylvania University, The Human Relations Commission, The eight Regional Advisory Councils of the Pennsylvania Crime Commission, The Regional Boards of the Youth Development Centers, The Community Affairs Department Advisory Council and several other agencies of State Government.

But along with this new voice, we will demand from youth a much greater responsibility in seeing to it that it help provide solutions to the problems it complains about.

No longer will we accept criticisms without involvement. Our young people have been provided excellent educational opportunities. Now we want that education applied to the problems in a responsible, constructive manner, not in destructive dissent.

For example, I have invited all our young people in the social

and applied sciences to join Pennsylvania in developing our very unique plan to solve our urban problems with our technological and scientific know-how.

The astounding success of Apollo 11 has demonstrated once and for all that American technology, adequately funded, can accomplish virtually anything it sets its mind to — and in an amazingly short period of time. This capacity for rapid problem solving suggests that our scientific know-how may be ideally suited to eradicating the gravest and most urgent problems facing this Country — our domestic ills. Yet our best technology has been conspicuously absent in most of our domestic programs to date.

Through a partnership which harnesses the scientific talent of business and the universities, we are engaged in a pioneering effort to apply these untapped scientific resources to such critical domestic problems as pollution, health care, and transportation. The success of this program as pollution, health care, and transportation. The success of this program spells better living — not only in Pennsylvania, but in every state which follows her example.

This is just one plan for helping us create a better society in which youth should and must become involved if it is to pro-

duce the kind of world it demands. Youth would be philistine in its idealism if it continues to think that social reform results merely from the recommendations of a report and ensuing administrative and legislative action.

Social reform is the product of social and political action that perceives human needs and aspirations, and skillfully nurtures them into ground swells of public concern.

Today's students are not too young to involve themselves in the political life of this Nation and I have invited them to do it.

For I, personally, believe that out of the chaos, turmoil, and change now swirling about our lives, there is a new and great age of mankind in the making. And I believe that today's younger generation will be its leader.

My generation, which fathered it and which is not supposed to understand it, takes pride in its potential. We challenge youth to

use it to evolve a life style that becomes in their time, a new standard for civilization.

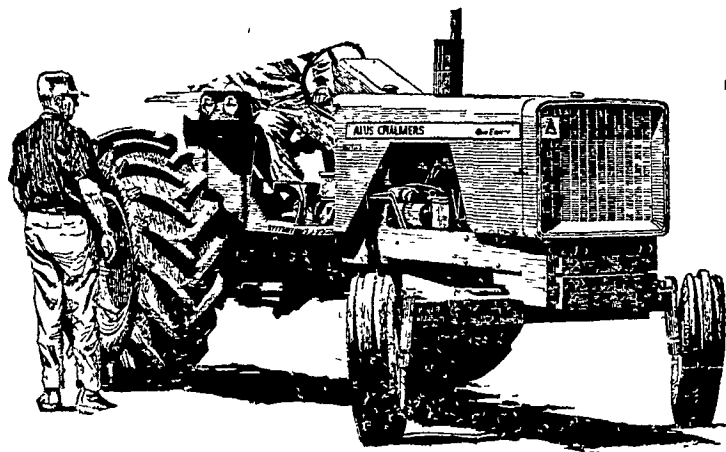

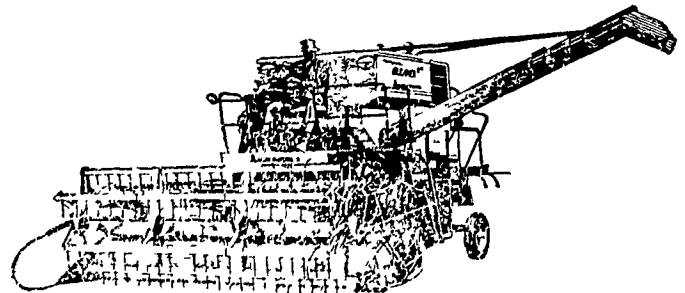
