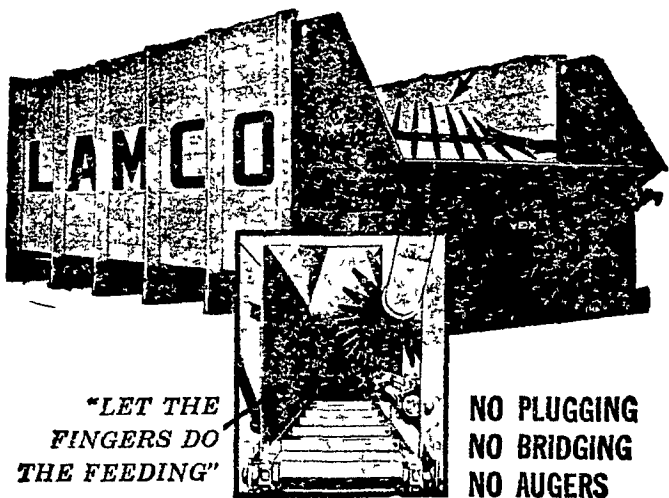

Scheduled In Gettysburg**

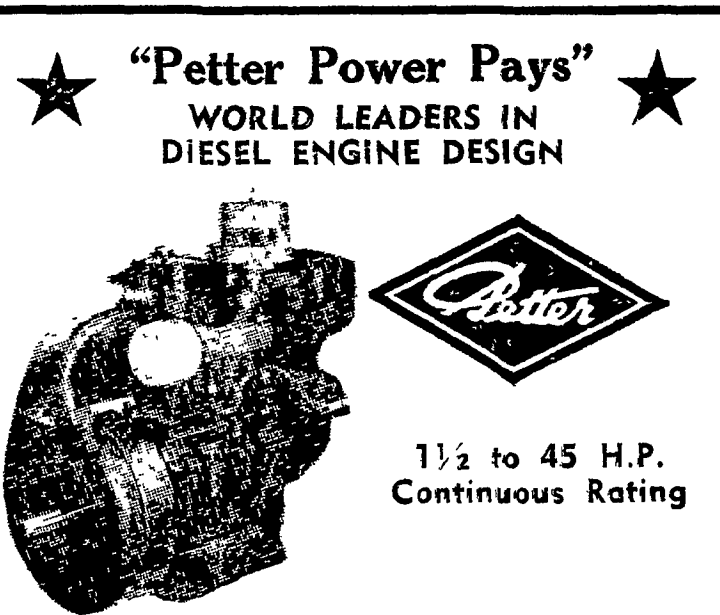
