## Eastern Pennsylvania And New Jersey

Prices of light type hens continue unchanged. Demand good however most processors reporting being booked about full for next several weeks. Offerings ample, despite high egg prices, as producers move hens off farms in order to make room for new ready to lay pullets. Slight increase, offerings of heavy type hens cleaned readily in most quarters at 14-14½c. Supplies of live turkeys for fresh iced holiday trade reported fully adequate however processing time indicated as the limiting factor as offerings available for sale. Prices paid at farm: Light Type Hens 8-11½ M 11c. Heavy Type Hens 7-9c.

Ready-to-cook movement fairly good on previous commitments, however light on new business despite lower asking prices. Less-than-trucklot prices continued to trend lower in effort to stimulate sales. Advance interest fair at undetermined price with a wait and see attitude prevailing. Live supplies fully adequate. Undertone weak and unsettled. Pool trucklot (Thursday arriv-



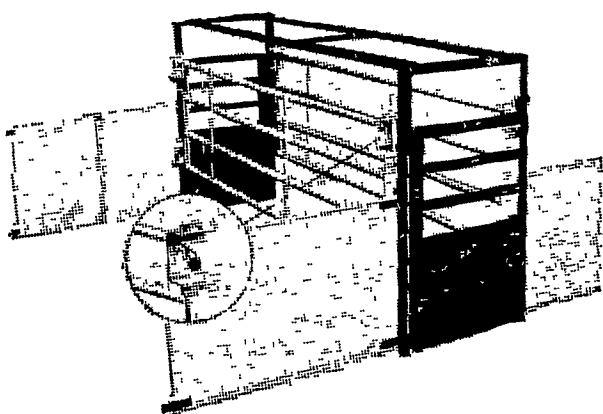
