



New Holland Dairy Show

A huge crowd estimated at 600 persons was on hand Wednesday morning for the annual Dairy Show held at the New Holland Sales Stables. As usual, a milky group of show cows were assembled for the inspection of nationally famous judge John McKittrick from Columbus, Ohio, and when the final placings were announced, H. D. Matz's three-year-old Thornlea Textal Supreme daughter was the grand champion and his four-year-old Rockdale President cow was the second place animal.

Calling the grand champion the cow in the group that "I would rather take home", Mc-

Kittrick said she was sharp and stylish.

In the afternoon sale the champion sold to Robert Kauffman, Elizabethtown R1, for the top price of \$2,400. The second place cow went to Paul Zimmerman, Ephrata R1, for \$1,475 and the third place cow shown by Norman Kolb, 55 Pitney Rd., Lancaster, sold to William Keple from Wisconsin for \$1,150.

In all, seven cows sold from \$1,060 to \$2,400 and the top 25 head averaged \$995. The top 50 head averaged \$835 and the top 100 cows averaged \$710.

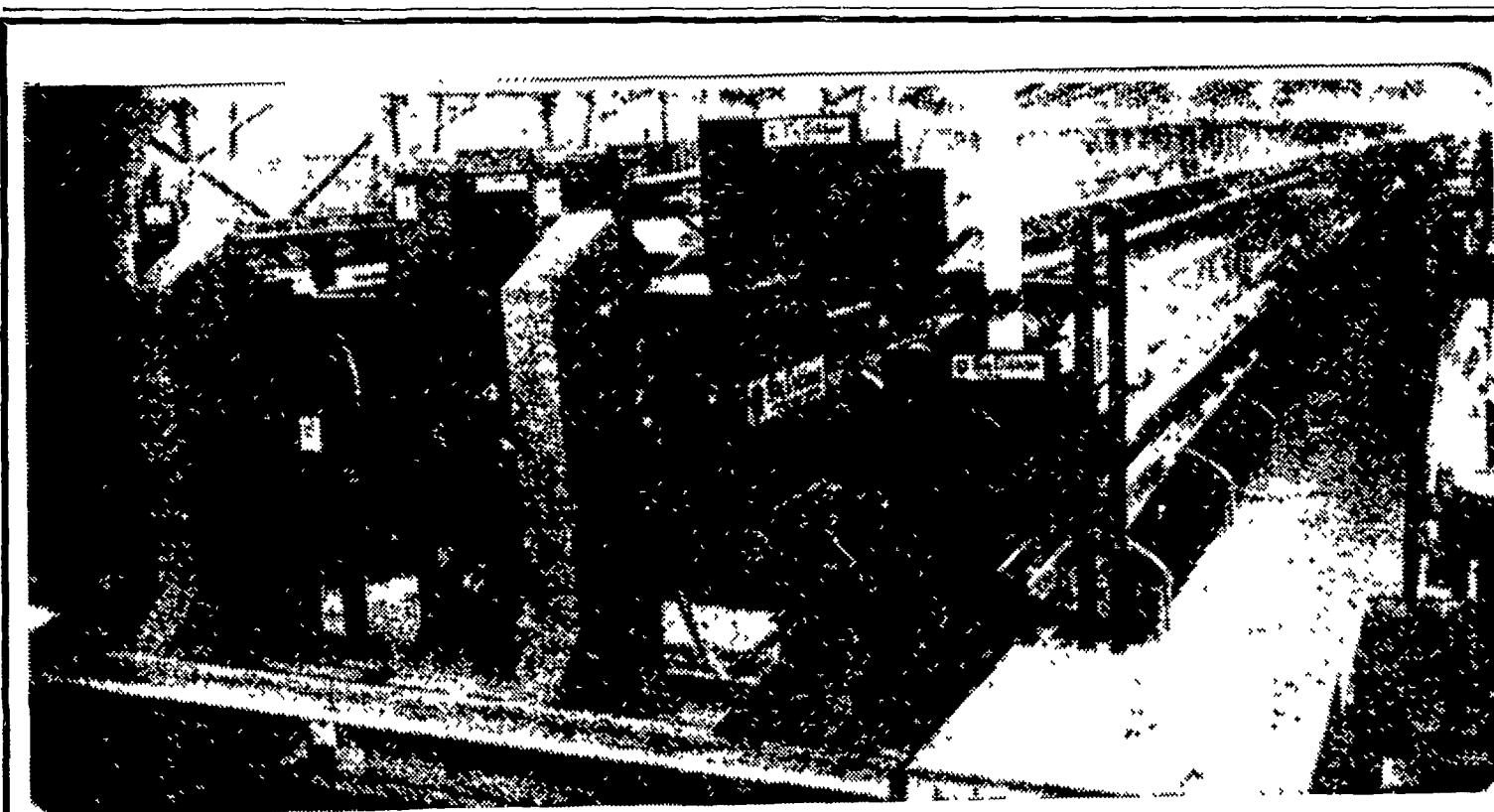

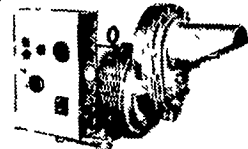
